Hello everyone,



The end of the year is not far away, and it is time to start thinking of strategies to maximize the tax benefits of year-end giving. Federal tax laws and many state laws make it possible to reduce or

eliminate taxes on gifts to charities like your parish, diocese, schools and other ministries. Remember that only gifts made by December 31st can help reduce the amount of taxes you owe next April. Please consult your professional tax advisor for tax strategies for your personal situation.

Securities & Appreciated Assets

Gifts of stock, bonds, mutual funds, and certain other property that have increased in value can result in even greater tax savings than gifts of cash. If you have owned such investments for longer than one year you can generally donate them to your parish and deduct their full current value, even if it far exceeds your original cost.

Congress has provided that in addition to regular tax savings, you also do not have to pay capital gains tax when these assets are given to a qualifying charity. This "extra" tax savings is another reason why some choose to make their gifts this way.

Following teen classes we will have Youth Group for grades 9-12.



Week 4 HEALING

REFLECTION: Sometimes our lives can feel like a rollercoaster, filled with high and low moments. As much as we strive to enjoy the positive moments, we know that they come and go and even if we do our best to avoid the low moments we know they are inevitable. We experience traumatic and dark moments that can leave us with lasting wounds and scars. But Jesus offers us healing.

He spent a significant amount of time healing those who were broken and wounded. Jesus healed others to point out his redemptive mission. His healing was not just for back then but for all time....Jesus still heals. Are we humble enough to bring our wounds to Him?

We must first ask for healing in prayer. After that, we have to identify what kind of healing we need; counseling, rehabilitation, or therapy may be necessary steps on our journey. Healing sometimes requires reconciliation with people who we have hurt, or who have hurt us. This sacrament provides us with yet another way to seek Christ's healing, for through them He "touches" us just like he touched the eyes of a blind man.


PRAYER: Jesus, you healed many people and still desire to heal us and make us whole. I offer you my wounds and the places where I am broken. Help me never succumb to a bitter sense of injustice or loneliness. In your mercy, hear my prayer and send the Holy Spirit to provide me with courage so I may seek help from others. Lord Jesus, heal me. Amen

CHALLENGE: Spend time today to identify an area that is wounded or broken and the next steps you need to take to find healing. Then take 15-30 minutes in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament if possible, asking Jesus for healing and the courage to take those next steps.

*If you need to find healing from past hurts, reach out to your local parish or diocesan office and ask for a list of Catholic mental health professionals whom you can connect with.
