Father Jeremy has asked Jeff Strock to write in his column this week to update our Area Faith Community on his journey to becoming a Deacon.

As many of you may have read in the October-November issue of the Prairie Catholic, I am currently in formation, with five other men, for the Permanent Diaconate; the third cohort in the history of our Diocese.


My first calling to the Permanent Diaconate began when the initial class of men was being invited to formation back in 2007. I also considered joining the second formation class in 2013. We've all heard the proverb "the third time's a charm". After a third invitation in 2020, and a length delay due to COVID-19, I officially began formation this past May.

The process of formation lasts for five years and consists of a number of areas and milestones (for details please refer to the article in the Prairie Catholic). By the grace of God, I hope to be ordained in May 2028. If ordained, it will be my pleasure to serve our Area Faith Community or wherever the Bishop calls me to service.

Typical ministries of Deacons include Word, Sacrament, and Charity. Through the ministry of the Word, Deacons proclaim the Gospel, preach, and teach. As a minister of Sacraments, Deacons baptize, witness marriages, conduct funeral services, and lead prayer. As ministers of Charity, Deacons identify and help those in need.

Please pray for me and Karen, and the other men and their wives, throughout this Diaconate formation process. *omnes ad gloriam Dei*.





Day 2 Spark series - Kerygma

Eucharistic REFLECTION: Some pieces of news result in big changed – an acceptance letter for school, a job, or a Revival home. Or there is news that changes the course of your life – the announcement of a pregnancy or the death of a loved one carries a different weight. Life and death: the greatest mysteries of human life, we all share them. We don't choose entrance into this life and we cannot escape death.

We spend much of our lives trying to find purpose in our birth and avoiding death. Can you imagine if there was news that helped us understand it all and taught us how to truly live? This is the message of Jesus Christ, the Gospel. Those who encounter His life can never be the same.

How can we preserve this message to make sure it stays alive in our hearts? Jesus is the one who teaches us how to live. Not only does Jesus forgive our sins, but Jesus offers us everything we need to "sin no more" (John 8:11)

It can be a struggle to choose what is good, just and right, and we may at times feel that we are constantly pulled toward sin. While sin always remains a choice, not a given, we find that we are often inclined to sin. The problem with sin is that it cannot only break our relationship with others but also rupture our relationship with God. Even the most private sin misuses the freedom God gave us and wounds our relationship with Him. There are consequences for our sin, but God's mercy is much bigger.

Now this is life changing news! Do we live like people transformed by the power of Jesu Christ or are we chasing meaning and purpose? Today is your wake-up call. Let the power of the Gospel take hold of your heart. Let it convict you in your sin can call you to repentance. The Gospel message isn't life-enhancing, it is life-changing, it has the power to transform who you are forever.

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, you are the everlasting Good News. By your Life, Death and Resurrection, you have accomplished the work of salvation. Pour grace into my heart and mind to receive this massage in a new way today. By your grace, solidify this message in my heart so that I never forget my purpose and my destiny. I ask this in your Name, Amen.

CHALLENGE: The four Gospels contain the Good News of Jesus. Choose one to read each day and recount His full Paschal Mystery – his Passion, Death, Resurrection an Ascension. Matthew 26-28, Mark 14-16, Luke 22-24, John 18-20.


