If you watch for the town papers, I should probably have a brief Christmas message in either paper in the coming days or so. In this bulletin article I want to address what I alluded to last week. Some have mentioned their confusion by the Vatican's recent document on blessings. Rather than writing my own commentary, I have found that the following statement on the website of the U.S. Conference of Bishops should clarify what the media has distorted in many instances recently:

The document released this week by the Vatican on the pastoral meaning of blessings insists that marriage is a union of one man and one woman in lifelong fidelity and openness to children, said Bishop Robert Barron of Winona-Rochester. Following the publication of *Fiducia supplicans* by the Vatican's Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, the chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Laity, Marriage, Family Life, and Youth, addressed questions and concerns that have emerged.

"In my capacity as chairman of the USCCB Committee on Laity, Marriage, Family Life, and Youth, I would like to respond to some of the questions and concerns that have emerged in the wake of the publication of the Vatican document, *Fiducia Supplicans*. The statement in no way calls for a change in the Church's teaching regarding marriage and sexuality. In fact, it goes to great lengths to insist that, in accord with unchanging doctrine, marriage is a union of one man and one woman in lifelong fidelity and openness to children.

"The blessings that it allows for those in irregular relationships are not liturgical in nature and hence do not imply any approbation of such relationships. Rather, these benedictions are informal and spontaneous, designed to call upon God's mercy to heal, guide, and strengthen. Despite some misleading coverage in the press, the declaration does not constitute a 'step' toward ratification of same-sex marriage nor a compromising of the Church's teaching regarding those in irregular relationships.

"Fiducia Supplicans is very much congruent with Pope Francis's long-held conviction that those who do not live up to the full demand of the Church's moral teaching are nevertheless loved and cherished by God and invited to accept the Lord's offer of forgiveness."

I hope that this helps anyone who may have been confused recently. If you're in need of going even a little bit deeper in the matter, feel free to let me know and we can arrange a time to just sit down with a group of people over a good cup of coffee and see where your questions go.

Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRTs) offer donors extra tax advantages while allowing the donor to set the life income rate they would like to receive (generally 5% to 7%). As a donor, you can designate your parish to benefit from your gift after your lifetime. There are many variations of these trusts, and we work with Catholic charitable foundations that can walk you through various alternatives. These foundations also offer the expertise of attorneys who work with every day to insure competent investment advice.



Week 6 MARY, MOTHER OF THE EUCHARIST

Revival REFLECTION: The Bible tells of a great love story between God and His people. We have been loved into existence, created by love and for love – eternal love in heaven. Even despite our sins. But this great love story hung upon a "yes" of a young teenager named Mary.

In giving God her humble "yes" Mary became the Mother of God. Thirty-three years later, Jesus would give her to us, so that she became the Mother of the Church.

In our Blessed Mother, we find more than an advocate; we find an example of how to relish God's presence. One of the new Gospel passages that describe Mary's actions is Luke 2:19, "And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." Here we catch a glimpse of her life of fruitful prayer, meditating upon all that Jesus has said and done.

God chose Mary to bring forth Christ into the world. For nine months, Mary was a living tabernacle. Christ physically dwelled within her. As we go into the world, we too can be living tabernacles as Christ dwells within us through our participation in the Sacred Liturgy and the Eucharist.

As disciples of Christ, we must allow Mary to draw us close to her Son. Mary's mindfulness, faithfulness, and devotion drew her close to Jesus, and following her example can help us to do the same.

PRAYER: Mother, Mary, you are the perfect example of discipleship and devotion to Jesus. We thank you for your motherly compassion and intercession. We pray that we may become more like you, living tabernacles filled with the presence of Christ. As we follow after your Son, we pray that you wrap us in your loving mantle of protection. Lead us ever closer to Jesus. Amen

CHALLENGE: Pray a decade of the Luminous Mysteries, The Institution of the Eucharist. In praying this decade of the Rosary, reflect and contemplate Mary's love and devotion to her Son, Jesus. Ask herd to bring you closer to her Son and to receive the gift of the Eucharist anew.
