Hello everyone,

I pray that you have gotten off to a good start during this season of Lent. If not, then there is always today to begin. I think it was G. K. Chesterton who once said, "If it's worth doing, it's worth doing poorly." So, if you can only do it poorly, that is better than nothing at all.

Today I met with the local pastors again and had lunch with them. We had a really good visit, and it has been a joy to get to know the fellas.

On Sunday evening I was with some of our youth at the second diocesan youth gathering of the year. It was good to be with the kids. The speaker was excellent, but maybe some of our kiddos were just a little too young to enjoy her talk as much as I did. The adoration and confession time went really well. It's always such a joy to see how a good confession can give so much freedom. Put down Palm Sunday in your calendars for a confessions at St. Raphael. We will have four priests again that evening to help out.

Recently I ran across an hour video of a discussion that took place between Jordan Peterson, Bishop Robert Barron and Fr. Michael Schmitz. In that talk Schmitzy (sorry, we were classmates and that is what we called him in the seminary) mentioned a couple of authors that he had read years ago from Notre Dame that helped him when he was starting out as a university chaplain in the Diocese of Duluth. At the core of what he was saying, he mentioned Moralistic, Therapeutic Deism. In a nutshell, Christian Smith and Melissa Lundquist Denton summarize it in their book, *Soul Searching: The Religious and Spiritual Lives of American Teenagers*. They summarize Moral Therapeutic Deism (MTD) in five points:

- 1. A God exists who created and orders the world and watches over human life on earth.
- 2. God wants people to be good, nice, and fair to each other, as taught in the Bible and by most world religions.
- 3. The central goal of life is to be happy and to feel good about oneself.
- 4. God does not need to be particularly involved in one's life except when God is needed to resolve a problem.
- 5. Good people go to heaven when they die.

Fr. Dwight Longenecker in one of his blogs entitled, *Moralistic Therapeutic Deism-What's to Hate?*, describes it as follows:

This Moralistic Therapeutic Deism, like the Arianism of the fourth century, is an extremely attractive religion. What's to hate about it? It helps people be nice, good, tolerant, compliant citizens. It helps them with their problems and makes them better, happier people and best of all, it allows for an easygoing spirituality in which one can have "spiritual" feelings about nature or your grandmother's birthday or puppies and kittens, but you needn't worry about a Father in Heaven who not only loves you but will also judge you one day. You needn't worry about his revelation to humanity nor his moral and ethical demands.

I just thought I would share these thoughts with you because I've been lacking for a name of some of the "stuff" that I have been running into as a priest and I think this definition helps explain some of it. Maybe some of you will find that some of your belief structure is like this. There are plenty of times where I find people like my homilies when they make you feel good, but don't like them when they are challenging and don't make you feel good. Now I think I have found a name of what this attitude might be called (when the homily isn't simply a dud anyways). The gospel is life giving in every way, but it has a real bite to it and we can't ignore this quality. I pray that we will have a purification of this false structure of belief in our lives and live truly according to the faith passed on to us by God.
