Tempus fugit. Time escapes—or, as we more typically say in English, time flies. This pithy phrase gets thrown around quite a bit in our day-to-day parlance: no doubt, as we get older, we only seem to notice all the more how quickly time escapes our grasp. For my part, as the weeks of summer fly by and the end of my tenure at St Raphael comes to its close, I feel time slipping away irretrievably. It's for this reason that I want to share a little about the next phase of my life, as far as I know it. I want to do this over the next two columns: this week, I want to tell you a little about where I am going.

Later this summer, I will be entering the Novitiate of the Society of Jesus—what we sometimes, more colloquially call, the Jesuits. The Jesuits are members of a religious order of the Catholic Church; a religious order is an association or community of men or women who consecrate their lives exclusively to Christ and the service of the Church through the "evangelical counsels," i.e. the vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. **Certainly, all Christians are called to holiness**—sanctity of life is not exclusive to those who become religious brothers, sisters, and priests; rather, it is the goal for all of us, in whatever state of life we belong. **To those who are called to religious life, though, the Lord extends an invitation to renounce other goods of the world and to be singularly consecrated to Him.** 

All religious communities have a particular way of life and service of the Church—what we call *charisms*, or gifts of the Holy Spirit to build up the life of the Church. The charism of a religious community is what sets it apart from other religious orders, and it usually inspires a certain manner of life that is particular to its members. What is the charism of the Society of Jesus? We can answer this by looking at the vision of the order's founder and considering how it has been put into practice even today. St. Ignatius of Loyola, who (along with a handful of faithful companions) founded the Society of Jesus in the sixteenth century, was deeply inspired by the witness of other religious communities—specifically, the Franciscans and Dominicans. The particular charism that animated his life and those of his companions was spiritual in nature: St. Ignatius experienced a profound conversion that turned his own interests and preoccupations from the hope of worldly glory and success to the desire for friendship with Jesus and total obedience to the will of God. Over time, St. Ignatius developed a manner of articulating ("putting words to") his spiritual experiences of the movements of the Holy Spirit in his life, and he developed helpful rules for discerning the will of God. What really compelled St. Ignatius and his friends along with him was to share this same spirituality with the church: to teach others how to respond to the movements of God in their lives, no matter how subtle, and to respond to God's grace with gratitude, love, and obedience.

This is why the earliest companions of Ignatius were renowned preachers, spiritual directors, counselors, and retreat masters. Their goal was to be totally at the disposition of the Church—specifically, the Holy Father, the Pope—to go wherever was needed to help bring about renewal and conversion in the life of the Church. This is why the Jesuits, from the beginning, have been some of the most alacritous missionaries in the history of the church since the age of the apostles! Within just years of their founding, the first members of the Society of Jesus were embarking on missions to the Americas, India, the Philippines, Japan, and China to promote the Gospel. Moreover, they were some of the most sought preachers and spiritual directors across Europe.

Fast forward to today: the Jesuits are the largest religious order of the Catholic church, with over 15,000 members across the globe. With that many members, Jesuits come in all shapes, sizes, colors, and nationalities: but the fundamental vision of the order remains that which was given to the Church through St. Ignatius and his companions—to help others "find God in all things," to encourage them to respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, and to lead them to love for Christ. In a special way, the Jesuits are dedicated to this charism through their ongoing missionary work (the Society of Jesus is still the largest missionary order in the world) and through education and work with youth. They also do a lot of other apostolates to serve the Church and the common good of society, which cannot be numbered here.

But why in the world do I want to do this? Stay tuned for next week's column, and I will have more to say on that! I hope to see many of you at the reception this Saturday, 17 June 2023, when I will have an opportunity to greet (and, alas, say my farewells). Let us keep one another in prayer in these days ahead.

~St. Raphael School~ It is the mission of St. Raphael Catholic School to bring students to a deeper relationship with Jesus while providing excellent education.

Still Searching: We are still searching for a 4th grade teacher and a 5th grade teacher for the 2023-2024 school year. Please continue to encourage the educators your family knows to apply! Daycare Update: Our waitlist for the daycare is currently open! If your family would like to get on the waitlist, please fill out the Google form that is found on our schools' Facebook page. Our licensing paperwork has been turned in to the county and is being processed. Katie is working on acquiring all the needed materials for the daycare, doing the required training classes, and setting up the classroom. I am working on policies and procedures. We still anticipate a fall 2023 opening for the daycare.

**Playground Project:** The school will be embarking on a playground project in the next fiscal year. The project will include removing and replacing most of the existing equipment and then using our current space plus a small part of the parking lot to create a new and redesigned space to fit our growing needs. We intend to create a fenced-in area for our youngest learners with smaller age-appropriate equipment. Then, we will add larger, new equipment for our 5-12 year old learners. We have one bid and plan and are in the process of getting another bid and plan. I will also be working on obtaining grants and other sources of funding!

When we enter the church we dip our fingertips into the holy water at the baptismal font and make the sign of the Cross which is to bring to mind our baptism.

The Sign of the Cross is a prayer of its own. It is made with our open right hand touching our forehead, saying, "In the name of the Father," to signify the Father as the first person of the Most Holy Trinity. Then lower the hand to the breast bone as we proclaim, "and the Son". This is Jesus, the second person of the Most Holy Trinity. Then to the left shoulder as we say, "and of the Holy" then move to the right shoulder, "Spirit" and finish with folding our hands together saying "Amen". The sign of the

Cross is a declaration of our Catholic faith saying a visible and public 'yes" to God.

Have you ever observed Catholics who kiss their thumb after making the Sign of the Cross? They make a cross with their thumb and index finger; the thumb is the vertical bar placed over the index finger, which is the horizontal bar. By kissing their thumb, they are symbolically kissing the Cross of Jesus.

We then go to the pew we want to sit in, genuflect, going down on the right knee and make the sign of the cross before going into the pew to kneel down. Genuflection is a posture the Magi used when they found the "child Jesus".

As you kneel there say some prayers, Hail Mary, Our Father and simply have a spontaneous conversation with God. I like to ask for help with hearing what God is going to be telling me at Mass that day. Then like any conversation, be quiet so God has a chance to speak to you.

Recall your sins and ask for forgiveness for these venial (small) sins.

Then sit back and open the missal to read the readings and Gospel if you haven't done so yet. There is a common theme to the readings, usually the first reading and the Gospel. Try to find it as you read them.

All this and Mass hasn't even started yet!
