This weekend, concluding the former "octave of Pentecost," the Church celebrates **Trinity Sunday**. Though in certain respects, this feast day is ancient in origin, it is also quite modern. **After the event of Pentecost, something of the inner-mystery of God is revealed to the Church**. God is "One": the Scriptures enjoin us— "I the Lord am your God, you shall have no other God's besides me." **There is only one true God**: not a plethora of gods or a pantheon of deities. It is only possible for the origin of all things that exist to come from the One God. And yet, we learn through the revelation of Jesus Christ and the gift of His Holy Spirit that, **though God is One in essence, God is "Three" in persons—the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit**. This is why, since the most ancient days of the Christian religion, we have prayed the simple doxology: "Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit…" **This God who is One-in-Three (or "Triune") is an eternal and dynamic communion of divine love**. This ancient profession of faith in the Triune God—one God, Three Persons—has been put to the test many times. **False teachings and incomprehensions have often challenged the doctrine of the Trinity**; but, remaining faithful to the Scriptures and obeying the command of Jesus to "baptize all nations in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (because, why would we be baptized in the name of anyone but God?), **the Church has always defended her orthodox doctrine of the Trinity**.

In a small way, the feast of Trinity Sunday is an occasion for the Church to reflect in an intentional way on this doctrine. In a sense, every day of the year is a celebration of the Trinity! Every day of the year, at every moment, we are invited, as Christians, to share the life of Jesus who unites us with our Father in heaven through the gift of the Holy Spirit—we who received a share in the life of the Triune God at our baptism are invited each day to live in true charity to let this life grow within us. Far from being an obscure doctrine for the theologians, the doctrine of the Trinity is at the heart of our Christian faith and is the supreme revelation given to our religion.

This weekend, we also have a few other exciting things happening which I'd like to highlight. Firstly, a reminder that this **Saturday**, **3rd June 2023**, **St Raphael Catholic School is hosting "A Night in Havana."** While I will take some time to thank our extraordinary team of parents, friends, and volunteers who have sacrificed a lot of time and dedicated many efforts to this night, I want to encourage all of you, my dear parishioners, to join us for this extremely fun night in support of our school. The mission at St Raphael's school is to lead our children closer to Jesus while providing excellent education. This fundraiser helps us to keep this mission alive in our parish and to support the important work of Catholic education. Thanks for your support, and I can't wait to see many of you there!

Also, looking ahead to this week, we have an exciting event in the parish of St Joseph. On Wednesday, 7th June 2023, at the 8:00 am Mass, we will welcome Cole Jackson into the full communion of the Catholic Church. Cole has completed his learning and formation in preparation for this important day: through the Rite of Reception into the Catholic Church and the sacraments of Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist, he will be received into our Catholic communion. While the Mass will be relatively simple, it is an important moment not only for Cole but for our whole local Church—so please, come out and support us for this exciting day at St Joseph's Church! Above all, let us keep Cole in our prayers as he is received into the Church; please, also pray for his fiancée, Talli, as their wedding is approaching in mid-June!

I am also excited to announce that we have been able to secure a date for our annual **Farm Mass**. The parish of St Joseph is hosting this year's Mass, and **I am grateful to Sue and Jim Imker for graciously offering use of their farm!** Because of the late-planting season an everything our farmers have been dealing with this year, we will need to have this Mass a little later than the previous year. Our Farm Mass will be in the afternoon **on Monday**, **26 June 2023**. More details will follow in subsequent posts, but mark your calendars for this occasion.

One final note: I will be away from the parish to attend an ordination from Thursday through Saturday (8th—10th June). I apologize for any inconvenience this may cause, but appreciate your comprehension. Let us pray for one another!





Have you ever wondered why we, as Catholics, genuflect, kneel, sit, stand, kneel, stand again, kneel again, genuflect again during Mass? We are using our body to pray! I have listed the different body positions here starting with the greatest level of worship. As we move our bodies, if physically able, into these various positions pay attention to what part of the Mass we are in, what are the words being said and where is our heart pointing us to.

Prostration is a powerful gesture performed only by those being ordained priests or deacons, or by priests and deacons at the start of the Good Friday liturgy. Laying on

their stomachs with their face resting on the floor "symbolizes his unworthiness for the office of priest and deacon and his dependence upon God and the prayers of the Christian community," according to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. The Magi "prostrated themselves and did him (the child Jesus) homage." According to the Gospel of Matthew.

According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, "A **genuflection**, made by bending the right knee to the ground, signifies adoration, and therefore it is reserved for the Most Blessed Sacrament, as well as for the Holy Cross from the solemn adoration during the liturgical celebration on Good Friday." When we come to Mass and genuflect before entering the pew we should be facing the Tabernacle which houses our Lord Jesus present in the Eucharist. It is a common practice to go down on both knees when Jesus is present in the Monstrance on the Altar at Adoration.

Kneeling is a sign of humility. It's a common posture for personal prayer and worship. The Bible tells us Jesus knelt in prayer too. When we kneel, we completely submit and surrender ourselves to our Heavenly Father.

Standing is a simple but profound way of honoring and respecting Jesus who is represented by the priest during Mass. We stand in unity when we recite the Nicene Creed and Lord's Prayer. We stand in honor when we listen to the Gospel proclaimed to us by the Deacon or Priest.

Sitting is what I call the base position of worship. This is the position from which we can stand and kneel. We sit when we are listening to the first and second readings, the homily and in silence after purification of the vessels.

I encourage you to pay attention to what body position we use in the different parts of the Mass.

Students going to be in grades 9-12 this fall, we have been invited to attend an outdoor bon fire and "movie" at St. Mary's in New Ulm. The first night will be held this Wednesday June 7 from 8:30-10:30pm and they will be showing The Chosen series. All you need to bring is a camping chair, blanket and heart ready to meet some other teens. I will be going over and would love to take a car load – or follow a train of cars from Springfield to New Ulm!


