The Mission of the Vine & Branches Area Faith Community empowered by the Holy Spirit is to bear fruit that will last as Jesus commanded: by celebrating and proclaiming our Catholic faith as disciples of Jesus using our God-given gifts; by reaching out to and welcoming all people; and by centering our lives on the Eucharist, sacraments, scripture, service and the teaching of the Church.

Hello everyone,

I pray that you are all doing well.

There are a few things that I would like to put on your radar in order to extend an invitation to all of you:

1. March 15th – Dr. Edward Sri is going to be visiting our diocese, at St. Catherine’s in Redwood Falls, for a day of reflection and will be giving the Bishop Lucker Lecture that evening. His presentation is entitled, “Eucharistic Revival in Our Hearts: Bringing the Liturgy into Our Daily Lives”. Please consider signing up for the day portion or come for the evening lecture (details can be found on the diocesan website and other places around our parishes as well). He is a very sought-after teacher and speaker. I’ve used some of his materials in my meetings with young adult groups in the past and he’s quite good. Easy to understand but containing spiritual depth.

2. March 21st – We will be having our annual Diocesan Chrism Mass at the Cathedral in New Ulm at 7 p.m. on Thursday, March 21st. This is where all the priests in the diocese are supposed to gather with the bishop to renew our priestly promises that we made on the day of our ordination. At the same time this is where all the Holy Oils for the next year are blessed and then distributed to our parishes throughout the diocese after mass. Please consider going if you have never been to one before. It is at liturgical celebrations such as these where we remember that we belong to something so much bigger than our own parishes. We belong to a diocese, and we belong to a Catholic Church that covers the entire planet. Parochialism is all around us these days (where we only care about our individual parishes and schools) and celebrations such as these really help all of us balance out our faith and remind us to whom and where we really belong in our faith.

3. March 28th – 31st. Holy Week. In a special way I would like to extend an invitation to all of you to come and join us in the celebration of Holy Week. I would like to extend an invitation for you to join us for the Easter Vigil on Saturday evening, the 30th, beginning at 8:15 p.m. I remember when I was a boy growing up my grandfather would ask my grandmother every year if the mass we were going to was the “long one”. She always duped him into going year after year. I’m not going to do that with you. Rather I will try and do a little catechesis leading up to Holy Week over the next couple of weeks to explain why the Church considers it the liturgy of all liturgies and the most important one we celebrate every year. I have heard rumblings from the recent past that it was too long, and people were upset. When I was younger, and a new religious order was being formed in Ghent when I was the pastor there, I also remember doing everything that the sisters wanted, and people were mad at me too because the liturgy was too long for them. With a little more age and experience I hope to celebrate the Vigil with you in such a way that people will be filled with the joy of Easter and not be complaining about the length of the mass.

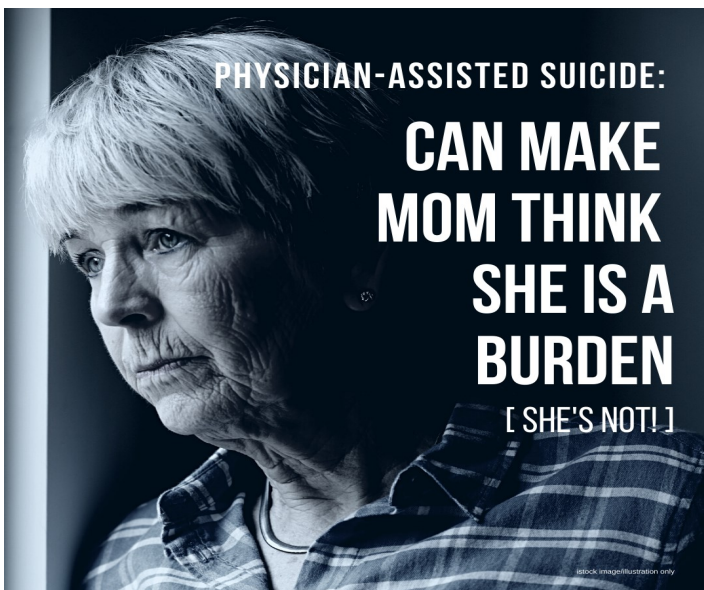

Elementary update:

First graders will be looking at the geography of Israel, Jerusalem and the cenacle as they are preparing for Easter. Second graders will be learning about the gift of the Holy Eucharist as they prepare for their first Holy Communion on Sunday, April 21. Third graders will finish their unit on the Sacraments of the Catholic Church with the Sacraments of Vocation; Marriage and Holy Orders. With each of the 7 Sacraments they looked at the outward sign and they looked each up in the Bible to read a bit about where the Sacrament comes from. Fourth Grade has entered the New Testament and are beginning to make the connections between some Old Testament events and how they are fulfilled in the New Testament. Fifth grade, after leading us with the Stations of Cross will study the Sorrowful Mysteries and what the Old Testament Lamb of God is so they can better understand Jesus as the New Testament Lamb of God. Sixth grade will take a closer look at “Holy Week” for the month of March. Starting with the entrance into Jerusalem (Palm Sunday), Last supper (Holy Thursday), Crucifixion (Good Friday) and finally the Resurrection (Easter Sunday). It is the Greatest True Story every told!

Saint Oswald of Worcester **D. 925-992**

! Is your life working?

! Whether it’s working great or barely getting along, there are probably parts you need to work on. So what keeps you from working on them?

! For most of us, it’s simply that we’re just too busy.

! Busy is not your friend. Jesus tells us to judge a tree by its fruits. What are the fruits of “busy?” They are usually: stress, overwhelm, anxiety, fatigue, burn out, and discouragement.

! We don’t want to be busy. But we still want to accomplish great things in our lives and fulfill our responsibilities. What if there was a way to do many things in a day, without feeling busy? And to do them with joy?

! Saint Oswald of Worcester found that way. Every day, he had a long to-do list, but he did it all with joy. How? He slowed down and focused on one task at a time, without thinking about the next ten things he had to do.

! Oswald was the Bishop of Worcester in the 960s. He accomplished so much that his superiors wanted to see what else he could do. So they made the rare decision to make him Archbishop of York in 972 while he was also Bishop of Worcester.

! No doubt his to-do list was now a mile long, but Oswald countered the constant temptation to feel “busy” by prioritizing his quiet prayer life. No matter how many things he had to do, Saint Oswald of Worcester prayed every day, multiple times a day. When he returned to his tasks, this prayer time helped him to slow down and focus on one thing at a time.

! In our modern world, it seems each one of us has an endless list of things to do. But that doesn’t mean we have to feel busy. We can prioritize our daily prayer time, slow down our pace of life, and focus on one thing at a time.

! That is a joyful way to live.
