Hello everyone,

I imagine that by the time you read this you will have already celebrated Thanksgiving. I pray that it will be/ was a very blessed time with your family and friends.

I've been pondering what I am thankful for this year and there are the usual's, but something else comes to mind that I want to share with the rest of you. As we go through this change in our society with the everincreasing numbers of baby boomers retiring, I am noticing it is getting more and more difficult to get normal things done that are so important to our way of living. I'm talking about the blue-collar workers who keep everything moving and working. Maybe we can all do a better job of being grateful for these hard workers and we can prayerfully consider inviting other kids to discern taking up the different types of trades that are so important to us.

There were a number of you that I saw at the school musical on Saturday evening. This town puts on quite the production. I had fun thinking about the core of the story as it was unfolding but was not able to stay all the way until the end or I would have been worthless for mass the next day because it takes time to fall asleep after something like that. What I was able to enjoy until halfway through the second act showed the power of fear and control and how destructive it can be. Fair enough, the pastor in the story had been through some difficult times in his town and wanted to protect the kids from ever going through another tragedy. All of that is good. It seemed that he took things too far when it became apparent that he decided to "take" control from God and play God in the community by limiting the freedom of people and denying something that can be very good... to dance. Why did he do this? I think maybe because sin was brought into that which is not necessarily bad in and of itself and it led to terrible consequences. It seems he was maybe trying too hard to protect them by making it a crime to dance. Doesn't that sound like the trap we adults can fall into when we realize we go too far and try to play God in order to control and protect those we are responsible for? God gives us the freedom to sin and make mistakes and maybe we can do a better job of not living in fear and allow people to make mistakes as well, while not neglecting our responsibilities. It seems like a fine line to me, and it is not always so easy to make the right choices in leading and guiding and protecting. I think a key in the story was how his daughter mentioned how her dad used to be a pastor that was full of fire in a good way and how it seemed to have gone out. Have you ever noticed that when we are rightly interpreting and doing the will of God in our lives that it leads to joy and greater freedom within, and people are drawn to that goodness? Have you noticed that when we are not living out of that freedom that fear creeps in and it sucks the life out of us, and we then have the tendency to drain the life out of others around us like the pastor was doing? At least that is how I saw it from what I was able to take in.

Hopefully I will see you or will have seen a bunch of you at the football game after Thanksgiving. I pray that they play a good game and that everyone stays healthy.

Day 1 Spark series

Eucharistic Revival Reflection: We all need revival. The root word itself – revive – means "to live again". "The Eucharist is God's response t the deepest hunger of the human heart, the hunger for authentic life, for in the Eucharist Christ himself is truly in our midst, to nourish, console and sustain us on our journey." (Pope Francis)

Revival is not just for this moment. It is for every moment. Revival begins personally. When we embody the renewal as it has taken place in us and bring it to other people, we become missionaries. Use this time to pray for revival and the courage to invite others to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist so they can experience new life as well. True revival is always the work of God. We can't fake it or manufacture it, nor can we force it. We can choose how to respond. Jesus is calling us something deeper. Do you desire it?

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, I believe that revival begins in me. I give your permission to revival the places in my heart and in my life where I need your spiritual nourishment so that my love for you may be revived and I may be more closely united with you. Give me a heart that desires revival for others and the courage to share who you are. Amen.

CHALLENGE: Just as the Holy Spirit brought newness of life at Pentecost, the Holy Spirit has been given to use to offer us the new life. Spend 10-15 minutes in silence, asking the Holy Spirit to bring revival to you. It may be as simple as repeating, "Come Holy Spirit." Be open to how the Spirit may make Christ known to us at this time.


