Hello everyone,

I'd like to encourage everyone to keep our farmers in your prayers at this time of year so that they stay safe and are blessed with a fruitful harvest and fair prices.

A few teenagers shared with me how busy they are these days and that they find it difficult to be at home much. I don't know about the rest of you, but it seems to me that this can be quite harmful to a person. Has anyone ever wondered why some people are so busy (I am not reflecting on this to be that old man priest who simply wants to complain about life today and longs for the days of yesteryear that were simpler and not as complicated)? Or for that matter why does it seem that so many people regardless of age are so busy (farmers during harvest I am not referring to you)?

Something that I was taught about the spiritual life is that busyness is not a virtue. It can actually be a form of sloth or laziness. Our faith teaches us that busyness can be a simple form of running away from God. If we don't take the time in quiet prayer to invite Jesus into what is bubbling under the surface in our hearts, minds, and souls, we'll probably try to find some way to numb that pain or shut it down. One of the ways that I've noticed as a priest that people deal with that pain is by using distractions like work or being involved in too many things. We can use busyness to run away from hurt, to bury hurt, to ignore hurt, to pretend that I don't need help with stuff. Maybe some people reading this are trying to fill voids within with worldly things like work and extracurricular activities?

Better yet, it was St. Augustine who famously said, "Our hearts are restless until they rest in you Lord". As a young man he tried and tried to deal with the pain and void he experienced within on his own terms and in varying ways. But God eventually broke through with the help of Augustine's mother, St. Monica, crying for his conversion for decades. In order share his conversion with us he beautifully wrote:

Late have I loved you, O Beauty ever ancient, ever new, late have I loved you! You were within me, but I was outside, and it was there that I searched for you. In my unloveliness I plunged into the lovely things which you created. You were with me, but I was not with you. Created things kept me from you; yet if they had not been in you they would not have been at all. You called, you shouted, and you broke through my deafness. You flashed, you shone, and you dispelled my blindness. You breathed your fragrance on me; I drew in breath and now I pant for you. I have tasted you, now I hunger and thirst for more. You touched me, and I burned for your peace.

I guess my prayer is that anyone who finds themselves in a space like St. Augustine was in, that you'll also discover the Lord as St. Augustine did. Maybe give Jesus a chance to break through by slowing down a bit and not run away from the pain anymore, but engage it in quiet prayer with Him.

CATHOLIC PARISHES CELEBRATE COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN (CCW) SUNDAY

The most Reverend Monsignor Douglas Grams has proclaimed Sunday, October 8, 2023 as Council of Catholic Women Recognition Sunday in the Diocese of New Ulm.

The National Council of Catholic Women (NCCW) is an organization of concerned women established by the Bishops of the United States 100 years ago to offer women the opportunity to increase their knowledge of the Church, strengthen their leadership skills, and deepen their spirituality through prayer and service.

The year 2023 marks the 66th anniversary of the Diocese of New Ulm. The Council of Catholic Women has been a vital force in the Catholic life of the Diocese of New Ulm since the time of formation. Msgr Eugene Lozinski, the New Ulm Diocesan CCW Spiritual Advisor, believes that when women give themselves to prayer as they begin the many projects that the CCW offers through their commission and committee structure, they become more closely united with Christ.

The activities of CCW are meant to help women become better Christians. CCW exists to help the work of Christ become more evident and visible in the world by helping women to grow spiritually as individuals, as well as building up families and parishes. When women become actively involved in CCW, they are building up the Body of Christ. By inviting and encouraging other women to become involved in CCW, they are helping them grow in holiness.

The Council of Catholic Women of the Diocese of New Ulm continues to encourage affiliates to work in our parishes to create a spirit of unity through prayer, enrichment and service in fulfilling the three-fold mission of Christ.
